
There will be a Toy week on 23<sup>rd</sup>. to 28<sup>th</sup>. July. Hope to see more members turn up to help.

There is no fee on Toy days.


Host for July will be George Blundell. The theme is Bowls with inclusions.

#### The dust extractor

Amazing what you find when the dust extraction system doesn't seem to be working correctly! At a recent Mini Day, we were surprised how much dust was covering the table saw operator when ripping some lovely New Guinea Rosewood.

After a short investigation, we found the outlet at the bottom of the saw was blocked by some debris. After removing a garbage bin full of sawdust plus a few slivers of timber we were back in action with the extractor system working just as we expected.

One of the (many) difficulties in woodturning is finding a design or shape that is pleasing to the eye. There are heaps of items such as vases, plates, dishes, bowls and plates in everyday use that someone has designed and made which just 'look' right.

The theme for August is 'Carbon Copy'. About 50% of a piece of wood is made up of carbon.

There is virtually no carbon in glass, pottery, porcelain, non ferrous metals and a small amount in steel. To save some brain power in coming up with a shape or design, how about turning an exact (carbon) copy of an item in your choice of timber.

Grab an interesting item from around the house and get straight onto the lathe, no designing required! Bring the sample item and your masterpiece to the August Show & Tell table and let's see what inspired you.




