
SHOW & TELL (NOV 2019)



























- Design the box including dimensions preferably on paper.
- Thickness timber, cut to width and length, and sand if necessary. Width is best if in multiples of 20.5 mm for the A10 jig size.
- Mark the 4 box sides with chalk to confirm orientation, outside of each piece and top of each piece.
- Select the right size Gifkin Jig base plate and associated router cutters.
- Mount the dovetail cutter (taking appropriate safety steps i.e. power off). Usually the longer sides of the box use the dovetail cutter.
- Confirm the side of the Jig that is used for the dovetail cutter.
- Mount the first side piece of timber on the jig with the outside facing out (away) from the jig. Very carefully get the timber lined up symmetrically with the jig base fingers i.e. equal amount overhanging the fingers on both sides. Tighten the alignment clamps with the timber seated firmly down on the jig.
- Install the 2 clamps that secure the timber firmly against the jig.
- Adjust the height of the dovetail cutter very carefully. The top edge of the cutter should be the same height as the thickness of the mating timber wall above the jig fingers plus 0.5 mm.
- Turn on the router and rout each dovetail. Start the cut in the middle of each space between the fingers and cut right through. Then move to each edge and carefully rout out the edges. Repeat to ensure a smooth finish.
- When completed all dovetails, stop the router and turn the timber piece end for end (i.e. with outside of the timber still facing out from the jig). Resecure the timber (by clamps and firmly down on the jig) and cut all dovetails on that end.
- Repeat this procedure on the identical piece of wood for the other side of the box.
- Remove the dovetail cutter and install the related straight cutter.
- Turn the jig around 180 degrees so the fingers for the straight cutter are facing the cutter.
- Install the first of the 2 remaining box sides and clamp (outside of the timber facing out from the jig). Tighten the alignment clamps with the timber seated firmly down on the jig.
- Align the height of the cutter as per the dovetail cutter.
- Rout out all slots taking care as previously.
- Turn the timber end for end (outside facing out from jig) and clamp.
- Rout out all slots.
- Repeat on the last remaining piece of timber.
- Try a fit of the 4 pieces remembering the alignment.

Base

- For a base made from the same thickness as the walls:
- Remove the straight cutter and install the small slot cutter. Adjust the height of the cutter to the base thickness. This may require 2 cuts depending on the height of the cutter. Leave a minimum of 3 mm of solid timber below the bottom of the slot for strength.
- With the box assembled, run the bearing anti-clockwise inside the box to cut out the rebate. Note that the rebate corners will be round. The corners could be cut square with a chisel if required.
- Cut the base piece of timber to fit the rebated shape. If the rebated corners are round, use a 10-cent piece to mark the round corners of the base and sand to size. Glue in place.
- For a thin base i.e. 3 mm ply that can fit into a slot and be free moving:
- Install the slot cutter and cut a slot inside the assembled (not glued up) box 3 mm up from the bottom of the timber sides.
- Cut a piece of ply to suite the size and shape of the slot.
- Disassemble the box, insert the base and reassemble.

Lid

- For a solid hinged lid:
- Cut a piece of timber to fit the outside dimensions of the assembled box.
- Depending on the hinge style, rebate 2 small ledges for the hinges on the top of the back vertical piece of timber using a straight cutter.
- For a sliding lid:
- Cut a slot in the top in a similar method as for fitting a thin ply base in the bottom.
- Cut off an appropriate height off one of the short ends to allow a piece of ply to slide in and out of the slot as a lid. Round off the corners of the lid (to fit the rebated slot) at the far end of the lid from the finger pull.
- Glue the cut-off piece of timber back on the ply as a finger pull.
- Assemble the box.
- For a loose lid:
- Rebate either 2 or 4 sides of the lid so that the lid has a snug fit in the top of the box.
- Apply a knob or finger pull to the lid so that it can be opened.
