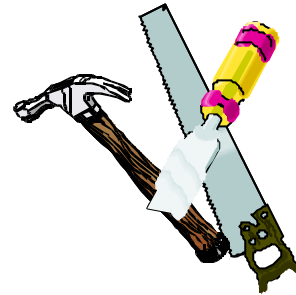
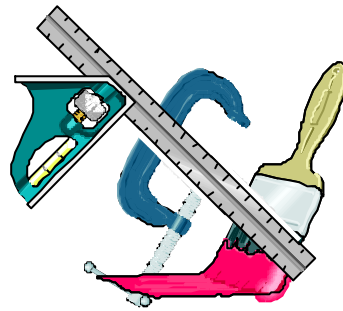

I am married to Valerie and have two adult children and four grandchildren.

I was born at Woonona in 1948. In my first year my parents moved from Corrimal to Sutherland where I grew up. I attended Sutherland primary then on to Jannali Boys High school finishing there in 1965.

I was apprenticed as an electrical draftsman studying at St. George Technical College where I obtained my Electrical Fitter/Mechanics Certificate and Electrical Engineering Certificate whilst working with Braybon Bros., an electrical engineering company manufacturing portable generating sets, mains failure units, switchboards and a variety of other electrical equipment.

I left there in 1972 to work with Dept. Motor Transport in their traffic signals section as a draftsman and finishing as an engineering assistant.

In 1974 I moved with my wife to Brisbane and was employed with the Southern Electric Authority as a draftsman in their sub-station/transmission section at Northgate and then in the city at head office.

I returned to Sydney in 1977 where I was employed with the Electricity Commission as a senior technical officer in their power plant design section; in particular the power station cabling section.

The year 1984 saw us moving back to Brisbane (a tale of two cities!), but this time as a theological student (it's a long story...happy to talk with anyone if they are curious!) where I was ordained as a Baptist pastor in 1990. To cut a long story short I pastored one church in Brisbane after which we moved back to Sydney for family reasons (the first move to Brisbane? Cheaper housing!!).

I pastored three churches in NSW; one in the Riverina and two in Sydney. Between churches I had a stint working for a cleaning company for 18 months and a few years later I worked in internal sales for an electrical wholesaler leaving that employ early in 2003 when I was asked to pastor a church in Auburn, Sydney.

I retired from ministry in 2013; all up about 20 plus years in the electrical industry and the same in pastoral ministry.

I joined both the wood turners and the wood workers a year or so before retiring as I wanted to learn more about woodwork and pursue the hobby in retirement. The last woodwork I did was at Jannali High school so I have a lot of catching up to do! But I always liked working with wood having built a few 'pretend' machine guns as a kid in the back blocks of Sutherland and a little 'shed' my Dad let me build as a young teenager (it didn't fall down either...maybe just slightly out of square though).

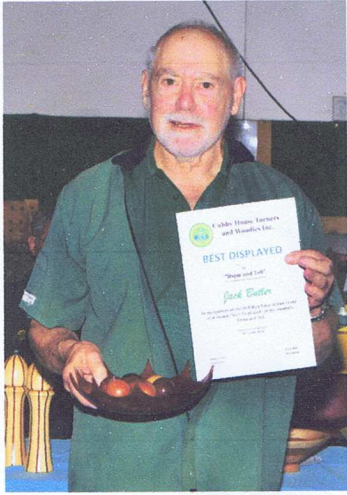
