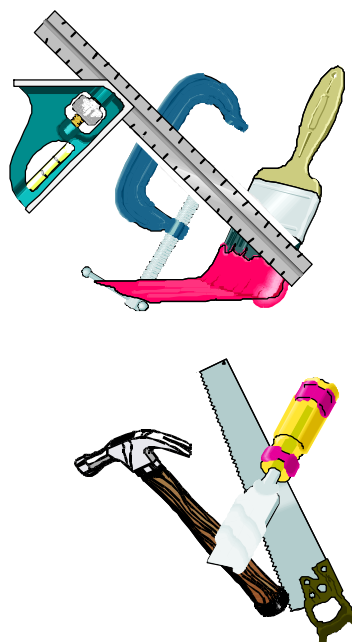

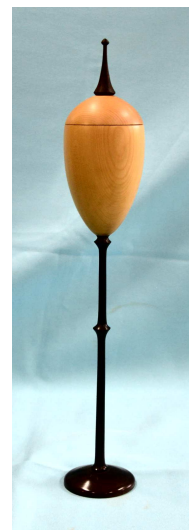
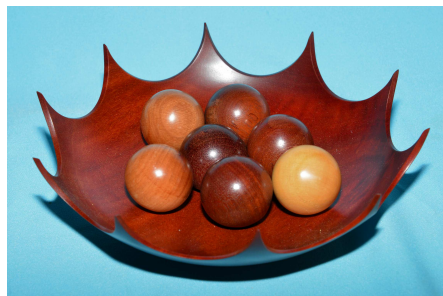

Members who have a Table Saw at home should borrow this DVD as there are so many different methods to safely machine timbers to your exact requirements.

The individual DVDs have been downloaded from the "Triton Heritage Edition Videos" numbered 1 to 41. In this series there were 15 Videos that had been duplicated, fortunately for you, these duplications have been removed from our library copies and the original series numbers have been maintained in case you visit the internet site.

The series covers 2 Cutting Modes:

Table - Saw Mode: Examples are: Basic Ripping, Cross Cutting, Mitre Cutting, Ripping Long Narrow Pieces, Tongue & groove, Tennoning, Finger Jointing & Compound Mitres etc.

Cross - Cut Mode: Examples are: Plunge Cutting, Mitre Cutting, Kerfing, Cross Cutting, Coving, Climb & Bevel Cutting, etc.

The original owner/manufacturer of Triton also demonstrates on his videos, it is definitely worth your time to view all the videos, you will benefit from the experience.

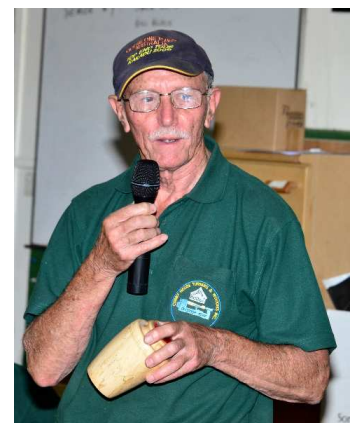

The price of milk has varied over a two year period.

In the first year the price rose by +50% for the full 12 months.

In the second year it fell by —50% for the full twelve months.

What was the percentage change in price up or down averaged over the two year period.

+ for increase — for decrease.

The cost for the first year was 1.5 units The second year the price fell by 50%
50% of 1.5 is 0.75. So $(1.5 + 0.75)/2 = 1.125$ so over the 2 year period the
average price saw a rise of +12.5%
