## Making a Celtic Knot Jig

Cut a piece of MDF wider than the mitre slots in your table top. (pic1)



I then used 2 pieces of scraps and cut them down so they fit in my mitre slots. I got them close, and then planed them down ever so slightly until they were a perfect fit. After they fit perfectly in my mitre slot, I planed down the thickness so the pieces of wood were slightly lower than the table saw top or your bandsaw table top.(pic2)



Here you see both pieces of wood fitting perfectly in my mitre slots.(pic3)



I placed some washers in the miter slots to elevate the wood flush with my table saw top. Place these on all four corners.(pic4)



I set the two pieces of wood gently on top of the washers. I then applied glue on both pieces of wood.(pic5)



I set the MDF on top of the glue, and made sure it was flush with the back side of my table saw edge.(pic6) To do this I used my engineering square, which I highly recommend everyone to purchase.



After the glue set, I tested the miter sled to make sure it was not too tight in my miter slots. It turned out it was a bit tight, so I applied some Johnsons paste wax. This did the trick. My miter sled now glides through the miter slots without any "wiggle" at all. Pic 8



Now, it's time to make a cut about half way through your new jig. This gives the saw line which will then be used to determine the angle. Do not make a cut too far back. Pic9



I then marked a dot midway through the cut. This is the dot that will align with the crosshairs on the protractor pic10





This is a picture of the dot in the crosshairs of the protractor, and now a marking at 30 degrees. Notice the vertical line of the protractor is aligned with the saw cut. Pic 11



Now, it's time to connect the dots. Pic12



Place a straight piece of scrap wood along your line, glue and screw. Pic13



Cut the excess wood.Pic14



You have now completed your jig for a perfect celtic knot. You can make this at any angle you wish, but I chose 30 degrees. Pic15

#### WOOD BENDING EXPERIENCE

I had a need to bend a couple lengths of timber some 1800mm long and 25mm (1") square in cross section and conform to a radius of 1500mm. Researching through our library and internet and our many learned members I decided to experiment with cold bending.

Whilst reading up on several methods ranging from steam bending, microwave bending, kerf bending, cold laminated bending etc., I did not have equipment for steam bending or microwaving such a long length; I also did not want to proceed to do a series of kerf-cuts as it would weaken the timber or glue laminate thin strips as the timber will be exposed to the weather.

I finally decided to try and cold bend a strip of green silky oak when the log was being slabbed out front of Cubby House on 4<sup>th</sup> July. The off-cut I used was next to the cambium layer & almost dripping water. I kept it moist wrapped in wet rags until I could cut a couple of 1" square strips.

I restrained one end of the strip & slowly & gradually started to bend it around the jig (refer photo) until a couple of inches was left to bend when the worst happened, it cracked !!! As the size of the strip was not critical, I reduced the size to 20mm (3/4") square. Success! I left the jig with the restrained strips undercover for 2 months & removed the dry bent silky oak strips with only just a small amount of spring back. A very satisfying result for me.
