Vale Phil Newell A Tribute from his daughter Kim





Dad was born in Carlton Sydney on March 4 1930. He died on May 19 2017. He moved to Griffith and spent the early part of his life and schooling there, returning to Sydney to live in Bexley. He finished his leaving certificate and completed his apprenticeship in carpentry and joinery at Alf Gould's

joinery shop in Rockdale. He worked there until Canadian western red cedar began to be used. He was highly allergic to this and moved to outside building work to alleviate his symptoms. When this continued to be debilitating he used his knowledge and contacts in the building trade to take on a sales rep job with Whitco window fittings. He also worked in this role for Corinthian Doors and then returned to finish his career with Whitco until he retired at 65.

Dad was married in 1952. He built his home in Snowden Ave Sylvania and moved in there in 1957. He only moved out of this home in March 2017 when he became too ill with cancer which had been diagnosed in March 2015. He was very proud of building the house for his family and we all have very fond memories of our lives growing up there. As a young man Dad was very keen on motorbikes which he stripped down and rebuilt. Another interest was rock fishing. He hand made his own rods and caught many enormous snapper and jewfish, especially at Avoca beach where we used to spend our family holidays every January. Dad had always expressed an interest in woodturning and on his retirement he joined the Cubbyhouse at Oyster Bay to learn. He was a perfectionist by nature and the precision of the craft suited him very well. He learned from those around him and as he became more skilled helped others to develop their abilities. He became involved in the organisation of the club with

maxi days and BBQ.s and used to love sharing with us the monthly show and tell challenges. He displayed his work in many woodworking shows across the state and he used to enjoy travelling to these with mum and others from the cubby house. He made many beautiful things which we keep in pride of place in our homes. His signature pieces were probably his "mushrooms" (the smaller ones) and "flowers" (the taller ones) which required amazing precision to turn their long and delicate stems. Gavin from the cubby house has his two tallest ones as keepsakes, 40 - 50 cm high. Another piece he was very proud of was made after he had his hip replacement surgery. He used his convalescent time to research and study how to make this piece from a magazine. It don't know what it is called but it is on my sideboard now. He tried to explain to me how it was done but I never really understood – just that is was very hard!! I think he may have called it his cantilevered curiosity. It was certainly not a functional piece like a bowl or vase. He also made lattice bowls which

fascinated people as to how they were made on the lathe.

Brain Teaser June An exercise in logic.
