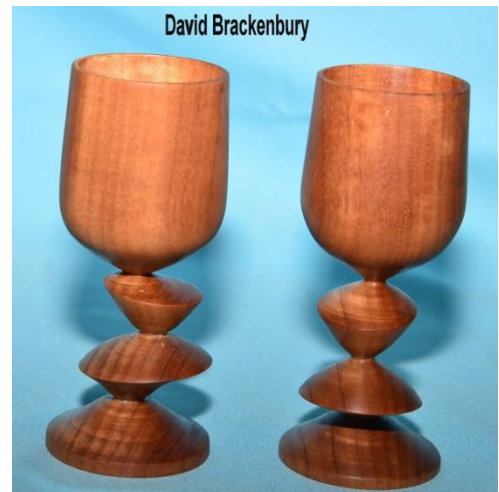

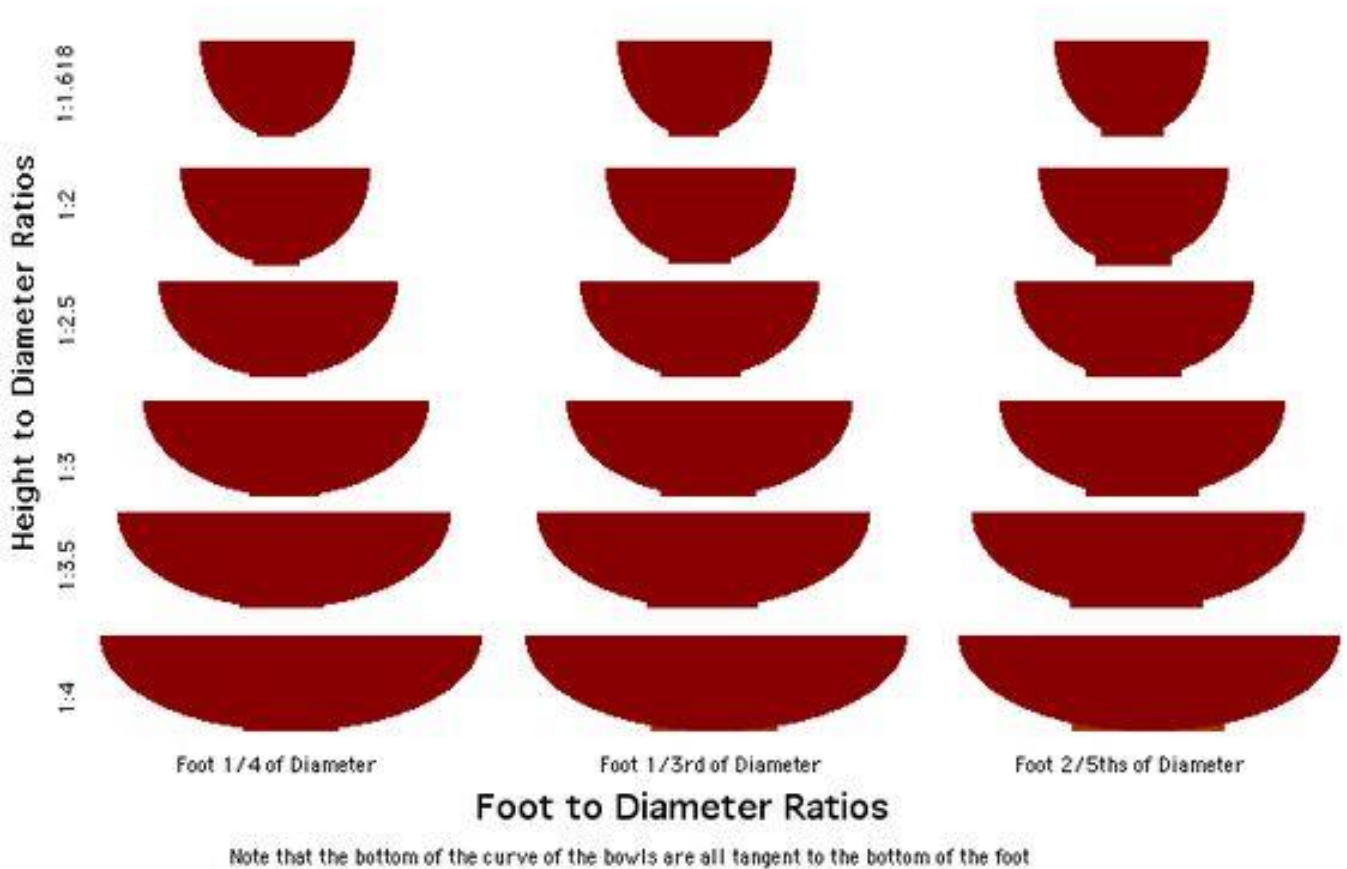

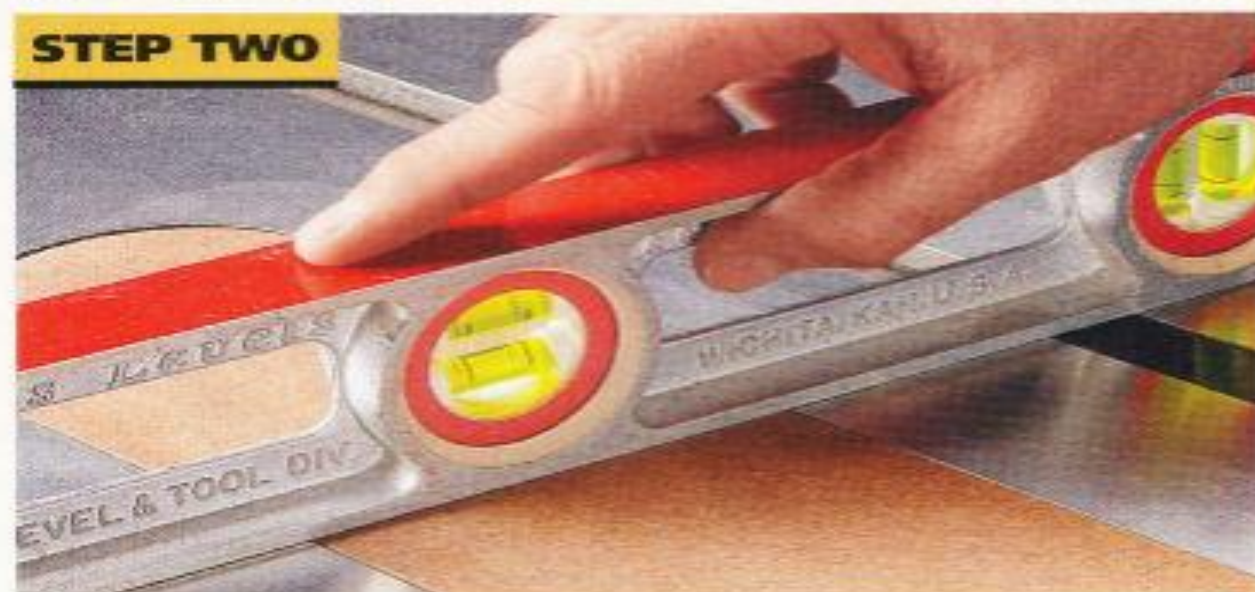

INSERT LEVELLING

Levelling a homemade insert plate on your table saw can be a time-consuming process. But I found a quick and easy way to tackle this chore using a hot-melt glue gun and some paste wax.

I start by applying a coat of paste wax on the tabs that support the plate. After the glue is heated in the gun, squeeze a dab of glue onto each tab where they meet the insert, as shown in Step 1. Then press the plate into the opening until it's flush with the table. I use a straightedge, like the level shown in Step 2. The paste wax prevents the glue from sticking to the tabs. But it sticks to the insert plate to keep it level. In just a few seconds I have a flush insert plate that I can use over and over.
